TAWHEED




Tawheed or oneness of Allah is the foundation of Islam. The first pillar of Islam is based on Tawheed. Shahada expresses the oneness of Allah. It is made up of 4 words Laa Ilaaha Illallah which means there is no God except ALLAH, which is the fundamental teaching of Islam.

Tawheed is the belief in Allah and all His powers. He is the All-Knowing, All-Seeing and All-Powerful. He has no beginning and no end. He doesn't have a partner nor does He have any children.

Surah Ikhlaas beautifully describes the uniqueness and oneness of Allah.

Allah says,



In the name of God, the Gracious, the Merciful.

- 1. Say, "He is God, the **One**.
 - 2. God, the **Absolute**.
- 3. He begets not, nor was He begotten.
- 4. And there is **nothing** comparable to Him."







Allah has the power over each and everything. He doesn't need any helper or partner in his attributes, power or work. He is the Creator of the heavens, earth, mountains, rivers, seas, animals, trees, birds, humans and jinn. No one is like Allah. He is unique in His attributes and powers.

The main purpose of our creation is to worship Him without associating partners to Him. He is The Lord and The Master of the universe. He is The Provider and The Protector. He is The Creator and The Sustainer. Each and everything depends on him. Hence, we should worship Him alone and seek only His help.

The opposite of *Tawheed* is shirk. Shirk literally means to associate partners or partnership. In Islamic terminology, it means to associate partners with Allah in worship. Shirk is one of the major sins and it is unforgivable.
